## ERRATA

Senate Bill 230, 1978 Md. Laws 1592 (codified at MD. ANN. CODE art. 89, §2A (Supp. 1978)) authorizes the District Court, upon application by the Division of Labor and Industry, to issue an administrative search warrant. The statute applies only to inspections sought pursuant to the following:

- (1) Article 48, § 176 of the Boiler and Pressure Vessel Safety Act;
- (2) Article 89, §§ 35 and 49B relating to occupational safety;
- (3) Article 89, § 62 of the High-Voltage Line Act;
- (4) Article 89, § 72 relating to amusement park safety.

The Comment in Volume 8, Number 1, pp. 88-114 on Maryland's Administrative Inspection Laws should be read accordingly.

In Volume 8, Number 1, the first two lines on page 119 should have appeared as follows:
